WHERE CHILDREN SLEEP - EXHIBITION OPENING

An exhibition that showcases the contrast between children's bedrooms around the world opens in early July at Expressions Whirinaki Arts and Entertainment Centre in Upper Hutt.

From brightly coloured rooms filled with posters and toys, to a collection of trash on a dirt floor, international photographer James Mollison's images *Where Children Sleep* paint a powerful picture of inequality around the world: a world of poverty and privilege.

As part of the exhibition opening Save the Children International Programmes Director Andrew Johnston will provide a presentation about Save the Children's work around the world.
